Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed." Genesis 32:28, NRSV


With school starting back soon for many children, I think back to the many "first days of school" that *I* had. It may sound funny to say, but one thing I really hated on those first days was the first roll call in homeroom. You know, when your new teacher calls out the first and last names of each student in the class, alphabetically by last name, and you say "here." Of course, with Buchanan starting with a "B," I was usually one of the first two or three on the list.

I hated this exercise for two reasons: first, because almost no teacher I ever had pronounced "Buchanan" correctly on the first try; and second, because the roll always had my *actual* first name listed, and so everyone heard "*Joel* Buchanan," which meant that I then had to explain that though Joel *is* my first name, to call me "Tom" instead, because my full name is … and all that. I always walked away from that experience a little embarrassed … hearing my last name get butchered … having to share more about myself than I really wanted to.

Names matter. They matter because they're *ours* ... They're *us*. As Frederick Buechner put it in his wonderful little book *Whistling in the Dark*,

If somebody mispronounces [my name] in some foolish way, I have the feeling that what's foolish is me. If somebody forgets it, I feel that it's I who am forgotten. There's something about it that embarrasses me in just the same way that there's something about me that embarrasses me. I can't imagine myself with any other name ... If my name were different, I would be different. When I tell you my name, I have given you a hold over me that you didn't have before. If you call it out, I stop, look, and listen whether I want to or not.

This essential truth about ourselves is key to understanding a strange, and yet richly human story from the book of Genesis. In it, we see Jacob facing a life-threatening moment of crisis and wrestling with God - a struggle in which he would be re-named and changed forever.

Like him, we too walk a long journey of faith towards our true home. The hope and promise of the gospel is that, on this journey, we are not alone. We often struggle, but we find that our struggle is finally with one who loves us beyond measure. We find ourselves *re-named*, living into the newness of a deeper, truer identity in the one who knew us before we were born, and loved us into life, and has never – and will never – let us go. In this unrelenting grace, we discover that we are now named *precious* and *chosen* ... and *beloved*.

Session Notes

- Session members discussed the Pre-School budget for 2020-2021. Final action will occur in early August when enrollment numbers are finalized (currently at 95 students). Director Susanne Hayes provided an overview of the cleaning protocols and practices the preschool will follow when it reopens and shared information on class composition for the age groups.
- Session approved Donna Rigsby and Susanne Hayes as authorized signers for credit card purchases.
- A review of the church's insurance policy was conducted. Session approved increasing coverage to industry standards and approved staying with the current provider.
- The Forum @ Friendship presentation in July was well attended and included a growing number of attendees from outside of Friendship.
- The family who requested permission to park their RV temporarily on church grounds during their move will stay at a local RV park and no longer requires access to church property.
- Session approved Pastor Buchanan taking time off July 22-August 3 and making alternative arrangements for services and outreach.
- The Property Committee was provided with names of local contacts who have knowledge of elevator or lift installations and will contact them for information. Boy Scout Troop 149 requested and was provided an overview of the service projects at the preschool and church.

Scouting at Friendship

The week of June 28 to July 3, 11 Scouts and 5 adults spent the week at Camp Rainey Mountain in Clayton, GA. There were many fewer campers, and overall fewer classes and activities offered, but on the positive side, the weather was cooperative, we had a campsite all to our troop, and our Scouts enjoyed working on a range of merit badges such as Basketry, Chemistry, Welding, Swimming, Theater, Environmental Science, Rifle, Paddleboarding, and more! The troop also was recognized as the "honor troop," or best overall troop, for the week, which was exciting. I had the opportunity to train other adults with a course on Scoutmaster/Assistant Scoutmaster fundamentals, and also recertified as a BSA Lifeguard; however, while doing my lifesaving training and demonstrations, I was exposed to COVID and ended up with symptoms and in quarantine for the next couple weeks after returning from camp. Fortunately, thus far, none of the Scouts in our troop have tested positive or had any symptoms.

Therefore, we ended up having the rest of our July meetings (until July 27) as Zoom only, and have been working on merit badges such as Electricity and Communication. We are planning for an outdoor orienteering course and compass training at the end of July, and also hoping to have a small group take part in the Council's "aquatics weekend" camping trip at Lake Lanier in Gainesville. That will be an opportunity to take part in instruction on kayaking, paddleboarding, and more.

In August, we plan to try out having two in-person, outdoor meetings in a row, followed by a Zoom meeting, to give options to all our Scout families. We are hoping to have the opportunity to do a trip in August to the Conasauga River in Tennessee to observe the local river ecosystem with local park rangers. We will also begin our annual calendar planning process, to the extent that we can predict out for the rest of the year! And, we will have new youth leadership position elections at the start of the month, for the coming six-month leadership term.

Several of our Scouts are hoping to undertake service projects for Friendship Presbyterian, following a presentation by Leanne Vaeth of several possibilities for the church grounds and preschool. So far, Scouts have expressed interest in helping with the preschool pathway and mulching; enhancing the pebbled area around the church's two white brick signs; fixing the seating at the amphitheater area; and possible more. Also in July, Garrett Anderson became our troop's newest Eagle Scout, after completing an online Board of Review with the district. Congratulations, Garrett!


